Standing Reports:

SAC Budget: \$8,854.70
Mr. Koger asked that \$1,300.00 for a Civics program and \$300.00 for a Community-Based Instruction field trip for self-contained ESE classes (to the Gulf Coast Explorium) come out of the budget. Motion to approve by Frankie Godsey, 2nd by Amy Zigler. Vote was unanimous.

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Discipline Report:

Mrs. Cozart reported that our referrals are up 339% from last year. Hobbs Middle has a handful of students with persistent misconduct and a few that are being referred for alternative placement. The main reason for referrals is classroom disruptions. A discipline review committee has been formed, met once, scheduled future meetings, and will be exploring strategies and programs for improving behavior. Mr. Koger is confident we will make a difference this semester.

New Business:

Mr. Koger announced that Wesley Meiss has moved, and Paula Snow is no longer on the SAC committee, so we need two new members; one teacher and one parent. Mr. Meiss was our SAC chairperson, so the committee elected Frankie Godsey as the new chairperson. Motion to approve by Doug Hatfield, 2nd by Steve Bienkowski. Vote was unanimous.

Upcoming educational transitions for Santa Rosa County: New Math and ELA state standards are being rewritten (no deadlines but may be as soon as next year); Santa Rosa County Schools are streamlining to a new software system called FOCUS; voters will elect a new superintendent this year.

Hobbs Middle School will celebrate Literacy Week this year with a school-wide reading of *City of Ember*. Literacy Night will be February 6th from 6-7:30 p.m.

Hobbs Middle School students will be participating in the Amazing Shake competition as they learn business soft skills. Students will have the chance to advance through a series of rounds as they refine their interview skills.

Hobbs Middle School 8th grade students will be participating in the HMS History Fair on February 4th. Winners will advance to the county level.
