
Milton vs Washington



Twitter is testing a new feature called 'Communities', which enables the audience to share tweets with selected and topic-based groups of users. "Some conversations aren't for everyone, just the people who want to talk about the thing you want to talk about. When you join a Community, you can Tweet directly to that group instead of to all your followers.
